

<u>Unpaid Taxes/Invoices</u>

2022 Taxes and Invoices were due **December 31st, 2022.** As of January <u>1st</u> 2023, all outstanding 2022 Taxes and Invoices will be applied to tax accounts as arrears and are subject to a penalty of 1% per month.

<u>Custom Work</u>

Plowing Snow

We would like to remind everyone that plowing snow onto or across municipal right-of-way is not a permitted practice. Guilty parties will be subject to fines.

Transfer Station

Animals Roaming at Large

Keeping animals within your property is the responsibility of the owner. If your animals are roaming within the RM, steps will be taken to detain the animals and all costs incurred in doing so will be the responsibility of the animals' owner.

Pest Control Officer

If you suspect a rat infestation on your property or on a neighbouring property, please call Denis at 306-220-8996. Denis is conducting site visits and will be going around to all yard sites doing inspections. Rat poison can be picked up at the office during regular business hours.

Emergency Services

In case of an emergency, please call 911. Ensure that you are familiar with your Civic Address and Land Location in order to aid the emergency services in a quick response time to your location.

<u>Controlled Burn</u>

The RM council would like to remind everyone to take extreme caution while having a controlled burn. Do not forget to register your Controlled Burns:

1. Register with the municipality: call 306-253-4312 or 306-230-1603 after hours and weekends.

2. Register with the Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911.

If a passing motorist reports a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, you will be fined \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighbouring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire. Please ensure you have proper Fire Fighting Insurance coverage.

Please notify the municipality as soon as possible of any changes to your mailing address.



SNOW REMOVAL POLICY AND PROCEDURES

PURPOSE:

The Town of Aberdeen shall set policy to ensure that snow and ice control is undertaken to provide for vehicular and pedestrian passage on roads and sidewalks on a priority basis. The Public Works/Maintenance Department shall make every effort to operate within budget as winter conditions dictate.

POLICY:

The Public Works/Maintenance Department is responsible for the removal of snow from all Roads, Main Street sidewalks, and Alleys where required, upon their discretion.

This policy is intended to be a general outline of the procedures to be followed.

Snow removal will be done whenever there is an accumulation of snow that warrants use of town equipment and at the discretion of our Public Works/Maintenance Department from Monday thru Friday, and weekends by necessity only. Sand/gravel will be spread on streets and corners where icy, and as needed. A layer of snow on roadways will remain for the protection of our underground infrastructure.

Priority 1 School Route – Central Avenue, Main Street, Second Avenue and Thompson Street Priority 2 Emergency Services – Industrial Drive, Fifth Avenue South Priority 3 Residential Streets, Main Street Sidewalk Priority 4 Alleys where required

RESIDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

Residents may help by clearing the front of their property where sidewalks exist. Bylaw 03/13 prohibits residents from placing any snow, ice, dirt or other obstruction, swept or cleaned from private property onto any street, sidewalk, lane, ditch, drain or sewer.

Many times the Town Office receives calls from residents regarding the snow removal equipment depositing snow at the end of driveways. Unfortunately, this is a reality of snow plowing, and it cannot always be avoided. If you have a neighbor who is unable to remove their snow from in front of their driveway please assist them, as we often do not have the resources to go back and clear driveway approaches. We ask for your cooperation and understanding as our staff performs the work of keeping our streets open and safe during the winter.

Taxes are imposed the first day of January in each year and are due July 31.

Please remember there is NO discount for the School Portion of Taxes

Tax Estimate Notices for 2023 taxes will be sent in December 2022. 2023 Tax Notices will be sent mid May, once the School Division levies have been established and the Municipal Mill Rate has been set.

2023 Business Licenses

According to Bylaw 12/14 the Business License Bylaw, all Home Based, Store Front and Contractor Business Licenses for 2023 are due December 31, 2022, and are valid until December 31, 2023. License fees: Home Based Business \$25 annually Store Front Business \$75 annually Contractor \$100 annually General Contractor \$300 (covers the trades, as part of the building permit) The offence for conducting business without a Business License is \$200. Bylaw Enforcement will be issuing fines for non-compliance. Forms can be found on www.aberdeen.ca







In order for Voyent Alert to work effectively we need more residents to sign up. Currently we have 203 people participating = 125 households (some are from the same household) which is great, 27 are still unknown to us (signed up anonymously). We need to know who you are. Of the 285 homes & businesses this potentially leaves us with 160 properties where we would have to go door to door in case of emergency (which can take a number of hours). The Voyent Alert sends out a notification of emergency in seconds. PLEASE for everyone's safety consider registering.





ABERDEEN AND DISTRICT FIRE AND RESCUE

A few winter safety tips from your local fire department...

- Never leave burning candles and plugged in electric heaters unsupervised
- · Check furnace filter monthly & replace filters as needed
- Never store flammable products around furnace or hot water tank.
- Ensure energy efficient furnace vents are not obstructed by any objects. Intake vents should be checked weekly for ice buildup.
- Only use clean well-seasoned (1-year) wood in wood burning stoves and fireplaces.
- Check and clean chimney regularly as needed.
- Test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors monthly push the test button.
- Electric heater Check for broken insulation/cracked wiring.
- Keep live Christmas trees well-watered to prevent drying out; turn off Christmas lights before leaving home or going to bed.
- Smoke alarm and carbon monoxide batteries should be replaced yearly.
 - Smoke alarms should be replaced every 5 years
 - Carbon monoxide alarms replaced every 10 years or as per label on pkg.
- Check fire extinguisher for expiration date or low pressure.
- Talk to your local fire fighters with any questions
