Q1 Has Aberdeen always been your home community?

Comments included: 32% indicated they have the basics, hockey and dance. Areas of dissatisfaction included groceries, health care, roads, could be more business friendly (fill up the strip mall), minimal options available, run down appearance of town. How to use the Rec Plex better and how to match people to their interests.

Q5 From your perspective what makes Aberdeen Unique?

Close to Saskatoon Quiet, friendly, relaxed Have the potential to be a great little town but doesn't seem to be proactive 50% indicated it was friendly and caring, sense of community Ferry, Rec Plex and Xmas miracles

Q6 People require many things in order to have a truly comfortable life. In terms of accessing those things that you require to feel content; what is the statement that you most agree with? Have everything they need in the community (2.15%) Occasionally rely on nearby communities (17.20%) Rely on what is available throughout the region (16.13%) Go to a large urban centre to get what they need (64.52%)

Q7 Lets say for a moment, that in the near future, your community will not face any major dilemmas, but will also not experience any new good fortune; given this scenario what would you say are the long term prospects for your community?

Comments included: 66% thought it would stay the same or find a way to flourish. Not enough focus on long-term planning, retention and population growth. Need for growth and new ideas, built on heart and hard work. Division between the old and new. Recognize it takes work.

Comments included: Many avenues to contribute. Not enough emphasis on what needs to be done – infrastructure. Little information from Council meetings, only facebook. New Council is progressive and want to see the town prosper, they are interested in input and open to ideas. Current Council makes decisions behind closed doors – conflict of interest. Include people on acreages. Not being welcomed into the community. Been shut down so why bother. Hard to find a sense of community. Want to find a way to be involved. Don't know how to get ideas.

Q9 If the right project came along in your community, would you have the skills and/or time you'd like to volunteer?

Projects of interest included construction, behind the scenes work from home computer, making the town more attractive/beautification (main street is awful), arena drop in center for older kids, fitness boot camps, fundraising, mechanics, community events, STUFF, more kids programs.

Comments included: 88% would have the skills. Need to identify the skills and match with what is needed.

Lifestyle/way of life (56.52%) People (55.43%) Housing availability/affordability/quality (51.09%) Cost of living (45.65%)

Comments included: Volunteering spirit of people, local school/Rec Centre both are crucial to the community, Quiet town away from the city/good school.

Comments on weaknesses included: lack of employment/business opportunities, Infrastructure, and natural resources.
