

Plowing Snow

We would like to remind everyone that plowing snow onto or across municipal right-of-way is NOT a permitted practice. Guilty Parties will be subject to fines. Plowing snow across the roadways creates ridges that settle and harden, creating serious hazards to motorists, grader operators, and potential damage to graders.

Animals Roaming at Large

Keeping animals within your property is the responsibility of the owner. If your animals are roaming within the RM, steps can be taken to detain the animals and all costs incurred in doing so will be the responsibility of the animals' owner.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired permits must be closed in a timely manner. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office.

New Trespass Legislation in Effect January 1, 2022

The Trespass to Property Amendment Act, 2019, and The Trespass to Property Consequential Amendments Act, 2019 came into effect on January 1, 2022. Under the new legislation, those wishing to access a rural landowner's property for recreational purposes will need to gain consent from the owner. Consent can be provided in writing, electronically online, orally or through signage.

Controlled Burn

The RM council would like to remind everyone to take extreme caution while having a controlled burn. Don't forget to register your Controlled Burns

- Register with the municipality: call 306-253-4312 or 306-230-1603 after hours and weekends.
- Register with the Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911.

If a passing motorist reports a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire. Please ensure you have proper Fire Fighting Insurance coverage.



Owners of land may withdraw all, but not part, of their cultivated land from the operations of the Municipal Hail Insurance Act by filing a withdrawal application with the Association on or before March 31st. Withdrawal forms may be obtained from the Municipal office.

THANK YOU: With the financial aid provided by the Government of Saskatchewan, the Town of Aberdeen received a Traffic Calming Grant in the amount of \$17,068, through the PSE Program-Provincial Traffic Safety Fund sponsored by SGI. We installed some traffic calming measures to improve safety and slow the traffic in our town. We did this by installing the traffic Logix Solar Evolution 12FM Radar signs at the entrances to our town. We installed radar signs at our 3 main intersections coming into town. We also installed Flashing-Blinker Stop Signs at the corner of 4th Avenue and Thompson Street.

In order for Voyent Alert to work effectively we need more residents to sign up.

Currently we have 180 people participating (some of which are from the same household) which is great, 30 are still unknown to us (have signed up anonymously). We need to know who you are. Of the 285 homes & businesses this potentially leaves us with 150 properties where we would have to go door to door in case of emergency (which can take a number of hours). The Voyent Alert sends out a notification of emergency in seconds.

PLEASE for everyone's safety consider registering.

The Voyent Alert app will say "you are subscribed to receive notifications from the Town of Aberdeen using this app" but please go into the menu and look under profile to see if your name is there. If your name is not there, please add it. This step is why we have so many anonymous

2022 Business Licenses

- According to Bylaw 12/14 the Business License Bylaw, all Home Based, Store Front and Contractor Business Licenses for 2021 are due December 31, 2021, and are valid until December 31, 2022.
- License fees:
- Home Based Business \$25 annually
- Store Front Business \$75 annually
- Contractor \$100 annually
- General Contractor \$300 (covers the trades, as part of the building permit)
- The offence for conducting business without a Business
- License is \$200. Bylaw Enforcement will be issuing fines for non-compliance.

Business Application Forms can be found on our website www.aberdeen.ca under the business bylaw, fees can be paid by cheque, cash, e-transfer or by eft

SNOW CLEARING

Residents may help by clearing the front of their property where sidewalks exist. Bylaw 03/13 prohibits residents from placing any snow, ice, dirt or other obstruction, swept or cleaned from private property onto any street, sidewalk, lane, ditch, drain or sewer.

Many times, the Town Office receives calls from residents regarding the snow removal equipment depositing snow at the end of driveways.

Unfortunately, this is a reality of snow plowing, and it cannot always be avoided. If you have a neighbor who is unable to remove their snow from in front of their driveway please assist them, as we often to not have the resources to go back and clear driveway approaches. We ask for your cooperation and understanding as our staff performs the work of keeping our streets open and safe during the winter.

SNOW REMOVAL PRIORITY

Snow removal will be done whenever there is an accumulation of snow on roadways from Monday thru Friday, and weekends by necessity only. Sand/gravel will be spread on streets and corners where icy, and as needed.

Priority 1 School Route – Central Avenue, Main Street.

Second Avenue and Thompson Street

Priority 2 Emergency Services – Industrial Drive, Fifth Avenue South

Priority 3 Residential Streets

Priority 4 Alleys where required

Please Note; A layer of snow on roadways is not a bad thing, it helps protect the underground infrastructure such as sewer and water lines from freezing up in frigid temperatures.


Please remember there is NO discount for the School Portion of Taxes




